- Determine senior management commitment to acting globally
- Build a detailed plan
- Identify and secure possible partners for your initiative
- Solicit and secure program financing
- Seek the counsel of others

Ways to Engage

- Raise awareness of the global epidemic in your organization and community
- Incorporate the Declaration of Commitment to HIV/AIDS in your work
- Advocate for access to treatment in developing countries
- Raise awareness and advocate for new prevention technologies: vaccines and microbicides
- Engage in a partnership with an overseas partner
